Tradition about Theophilus

- "Theophilus", both a common name and an honorary title among the learned (academic) Romans and Jews of the era.
- The Coptic Church claims that the person was a Jew of Alexandria.

 Honorary title (academia) tradition maintains that Theophilus was not a person. The word in Greek means "Friend of God" and thus both Luke and Acts were addressed to anyone who fits that description.

Could he be a Priest of Israel?

According to Wikipedia:

A growing belief points to Theophilus ben Ananus, High Priest of the Temple in Jerusalem from 37-41 In this tradition Theophilus would have been both a kohen and a Sadducee. That would make him the son of Annas and brother-in-law of Caiaphas, raised in the Jewish Temple.

From Wikipedia:

Theophilus was the High Priest in the Second Temple in Jerusalem from AD 37 to 41 according to Josephus's Antiquities of the Jews. He was a member of one of the wealthiest and most influential Jewish families in judaea Province during the first century. According to some traditions he was the person to whom the Gospel of Luke is addressed.

Archeological evidence confirming the existence of Theophilos the High Priest as an ossuary has been discovered bearing the inscription, Johanna granddaughter of Theophilos, the High Priest.

Some clues to support why Theophilos was believed to be a Priest is base on the structure of the book of Luke's first chapter

- He begins the story with an account of Zacharias the righteous priest who had a Temple vision of an angel (1:5-25).
- Luke quickly moves to account Mary's purification (niddah),
- Yeshua's Temple redemption (pidyon ha-ben) rituals (2:21-39)

 then to Yeshua's pilgrimage to the Temple when he was twelve (2:46), possibly implying his bar mitzvah



Soncino Zohar, Shemoth, Section 2, Page 220a

Said R. Simeon: 'At the time when the dead will be awakened and be in readiness for the resurrection in the Holy Land, legions upon legions will arise on the soil of Galilee, as it is there that the Messiah is destined to reveal himself. For that is the portion of Joseph, and it was the first part of the Holy Land to be destroyed, and it was there that the exile of Israel and their dispersion among the nations began, as Scripture says, "but they are not grieved for the hurt of Joseph" (Amos 6:6).

What is the Kingdom of YHVH? The 12 Tribes of srae

Why did Yeshua answered this way? **Acts 1:7** He said to them, "It isn't for you to know times or seasons which the Father has set within his own authority.

In early Talmudic times, the Rabbis were aware that Scripture gave conflicting descriptions of Mashiach. We find a discussion in the Talmud on this issue:

"R. Joshua opposed two verses: it is written, 'And behold, one like the son of man came with the clouds of heaven', whilst elsewhere it is written, 'behold, thy king cometh unto thee, lowly, and riding upon an donkey!"16 After much discussion on these seeming contradictory passages, the Rabbis concluded: "If they (Israel) are meritorious, he will come with the clouds of heaven; if not, lowly and riding upon an donkey." 17

One of the most detailed and powerful descriptions of the role of Mashiach Ben Yosef is found in the Zohar:

"When the Mashiach hears of the great suffering of Israel in their dispersion, and of the wicked amongst them who seek not to know their Master, he weeps aloud on account of those wicked ones amongst them, as it is written:

"But he was wounded because of our transgression, he was crushed because of our iniquities." ... The Mashiach, on his part, enters a certain Hall in the Garden of Eden, called the Hall of the Afflicted.

There he calls for all the diseases and pains and sufferings of Israel, bidding them settle on himself, which they do. And were it not that he thus eases the burden from Israel, taking it on himself, no one could endure the sufferings meted out to Israel in explation on account of their neglect of the Torah. So **Scripture** says

"Surely our diseases he did bear." As long as Israel were in the Holy Land, by means of the Temple service and sacrifices they averted all evil diseases and afflictions from the world. Now it is the Mashiach who is the means of averting them from mankind until the time when a man quits this world and receives his punishment..."

Acts 1:8 But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you. You will be witnesses to me in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the uttermost parts of the earth."

Josephus Wrote About the Lost Tribes of Israel


Where was the exact place of the Ten Lost Tribes of Israel to be carried captive in Assyrian Empire? The Bible records: "the king of Assyria carried Israel away captive to Assyria, and put them in Halah and by the Habor, the River of Gozan, and in the cities of the Medes." (2 Kings 18:11)

These places are located in today's northern Iraq or Northwest Iran called Kurdistan. The Ten Tribes of Israel were firstly compelled to emigrate there, and this is also a starting point of our research. In his book of history, there is a description about whereabouts of the Ten Tribes: Antiquities 11:2

"...the Ten Tribes who are beyond the Euphrates till now, and are an immense multitude, whose numbers cannot be estimated."

Antiquities of the Jews (Book X Ch.9)

According to "Flavius Josephus:"...the entire body of the people of Israel remained in that country; wherefore there are **but two** tribes in Asia and Europe subject to the **Romans**, while <u>the ten tribes are</u> <u>beyond Euphrates till now,</u> <u>and are an immense</u> <u>multitude, and not to be</u> <u>estimated by numbers." -</u> Where were the 10 Tribes of Israel in the 1st Century AD/CE?



Josephus makes a semi-

veiled reference to the Ten Tribes of Israel being located in Partian territory, Rome's arch rival across the Euphrates River. "Who are the Parthians today?" ...or rather: "Where did Parthian and Saka-Scythianrelated peoples go in later centuries?"



In the early 4th century ad, Eusebius recorded that the Apostle Thomas went to Parthia and Andrew went to Scythia—areas near the Black and **Caspian Seas where the Israelites** were located (History of the Church, 3:1:1). Early traditions also link the ministries of Bartholomew and Philip to these same areas, indicating that the Apostles knew the location of the Israelite tribes in their day.




Who was the Audience of Paul?



Jeremiah 46:28 Fear thou not, O Jacob my servant, saith the LORD: for I am with thee; for I will make a full end of all the nations whither I have driven thee: but I will not make a full end of thee, but correct thee in measure; yet will I not leave thee wholly unpunished.

Jeremiah 23:

2 Therefore thus saith the LORD God of Israel against the pastors that feed my people; Ye have scattered my flock, and driven them away, and have not visited them: behold, I will visit upon you the evil of your doings, saith the LORD. 3 And I will gather the remnant of my flock out of all countries whither I have driven them, and will bring them again to their folds; and they shall be fruitful and increase.

Jeremiah 23: 4 I will set up shepherds over them, who shall feed them; and they shall fear no more, nor be dismayed, neither shall any be lacking, says Yahweh.

5 Behold, the days come, says Yahweh, that I will raise to David a righteous Branch, and he shall reign as king and deal wisely, and shall execute justice and righteousness in the land.

Eph 2: 11 Therefore remember that once you, the Gentiles in the flesh, who are called "uncircumcision" by that which is called "circumcision," (in the flesh, made by hands);

12 that you were at that time separate from Christ, alienated from the <u>commonwealth</u> of Israel, and strangers from the covenants of the promise, having no hope and without God in the world.

Acts 2:39

For the promise is unto you, and to your children, and to all that are <u>afar off</u>, even as many as the Lord our God shall call.

Ephesians 2: 13 But now in Yeshua Messiah you who once were far off are made near in the blood of Messiah. 14 For he is our peace, who made both one, and broke down the middle wall of partition,

15 having abolished in the flesh the hostility, the law of commandments contained in ordinances, that he might create in himself one new man of the two, making peace; 16 and might reconcile them both in one body to God through the cross, having killed the hostility thereby.

17 He came and preached peace to you who were far off and to those who were near.
18 For through him we both have our access in one Spirit to the Father.

19 So then you are no longer strangers and foreigners, but you are fellow citizens with the saints, and of the household of God, Daniel 9:7 Lord, righteousness belongs to you, but to us confusion of face, as at this day; to the men of Judah, and to the inhabitants of Jerusalem, and to all Israel, who are near, and who are far off, through all the countries where you have driven them, because of their trespass that they have trespassed against you.

Ezequiel 6:

11 Thus says the Lord Yahweh: Smite with your hand, and stamp with your foot, and say, Alas! because of all the evil abominations of the house of Israel; for they shall fall by the sword, by the famine, and by the pestilence. 12 He who is far off shall die of the pestilence; and he who is near shall fall by the sword; and he who remains and is besieged shall die by the famine: thus will I accomplish my wrath on them.

Ezequiel 11:

14 The word of Yahweh came to me, saying,

15 Son of man, your brothers, even your brothers, the men of your relatives, and all the house of Israel, all of them, [are they] to whom the inhabitants of Jerusalem have said, Get you far from Yahweh; to us is this land given for a possession.

Ezequiel 11:16 Therefore say, Thus says the Lord Yahweh: Whereas I have removed them far off among the nations, and whereas I have scattered them among the countries, yet will I be to them a sanctuary for a little while in the countries where they are come.

17 Therefore say, Thus says the Lord Yahweh: I will gather you from the peoples, and assemble you out of the countries where you have been scattered, and I will give you the land of Israel.

Isaiah 57:

16 For I will not contend forever, neither will I be always angry; for the spirit would faint before me, and the souls who I have made.

17 For the iniquity of his covetousness was I angry, and struck him; I hid [my face] and was angry; and he went on backsliding in the way of his heart.

Isaiah 57:

18 I have seen his ways, and will heal him: I will lead him also, and restore comforts to him and to his mourners.
19 I create the fruit of the lips: Peace, peace, to him who is far off and to him who is near, says Yahweh; and I will heal him.

Acts 2:41 Then those who gladly received his word were baptized. There were added that day about three thousand souls.

Exodus 32:

27 He said to them, "Thus says Yahweh, the God of Israel, 'Every man put his sword on his thigh, and go back and forth from gate to gate throughout the camp, and every man kill his brother, and every man his companion, and every man his neighbor." 28 The sons of Levi did according to the word of Moses: and there fell of the people that day about three thousand men.

Conclusion

In this study we discovered that the Message of the disciples was the same as the Teachings of Yeshua in seeking for the disperse Tribes of Israel.

Acts 15:

15 This agrees with the words of the prophets. As it is written,

16 'After these things I will return. I will again build the tent of David, which has fallen. I will again build its ruins. I will set it up,
17 That the rest of men may seek after the Lord; All the Gentiles who are called by my name, Says the Lord, who does all these things.

Amos 9:

7 Are you not like the children of the Ethiopians to me, children of Israel?" says Yahweh. "Haven't I brought up Israel out of the land of Egypt, and the Philistines from Caphtor, and the Syrians from Kir? 8 Behold, the eyes of the Lord Yahweh are on the sinful kingdom, and I will destroy it from off the surface of the earth; except that I will not utterly destroy the house of Jacob," says Yahweh.
